As we begin a new year, I would like to reflect on a few of our top achievements from 2018. Last year marked a number of accomplishments for St. Joseph Hospital. We were recognized as one of the "Best Regional Hospitals" in the Los Angeles/Orange County metropolitan area by U.S. News & World Report for the fourth consecutive year. Our rankings placed us in the top 10 hospitals - out of over 270 in our area - and earned us "High Performing" scores in eight types of care. In addition to receiving five Women's Choice Awards® during the first half of 2018, St. Joseph Hospital was also named one of "America's 100 Best Hospitals for Patient Experience" by Women's Choice for the second year in a row. These prestigious awards not only help patients make informed decisions about where to receive care, but they also highlight the clinical excellence and quality outcomes that our caregivers and physicians work around-the-clock to achieve.

Another milestone we celebrated last year was the 10-year anniversary of The Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment. During the center's "Jubilee" event and at Celebration 2018, I had the opportunity to meet patients undergoing cancer treatment and others who were marking five, 10, and 20 years or more of being cancer-free. One of our patients described how St. Joseph Hospital changed his life. He shared that our cancer care physicians, nurses, navigators and staff not only gave him a second chance at life, but because of the life-saving treatment he received, he is now able to experience fatherhood. Robotically-Assisted, Minimally-Invasive Surgery

The Future is Now! The Evidence is Clear.

Fewer complications, less pain, and quicker recovery times. It is for these reasons that both surgeons and patients are calling for greater access to surgical robots.

As one of the busiest surgical centers in the state of California, St. Joseph Hospital's robotics and minimally invasive treatment program has a rich history of delivering the most advanced medical care in an environment that has earned national recognition for quality and patient safety. Our program is among the most highly rated in Orange County for clinical outcomes and patient satisfaction.

St. Joseph Hospital surgeons are leaders in robotics and minimally invasive surgery, having performed more than 6,000 cases since we obtained our first da Vinci surgical robot in 2003. Many of our surgeons pioneered minimally invasive techniques and have garnered national

attention for their achievements. Some of our robotics experts are internationally renowned and are invited to present robotic techniques to surgeons throughout the world. This level of expertise has led to improved outcomes, faster recovery times, smaller incisions, and less physical and emotional stress for patients and their families.

St. Joseph Hospital uses minimally invasive and robotic procedures to treat a wide range of medical conditions, including surgery for weight loss, cardiology, colorectal surgery, gynecology, interventional radiology, neurology, ophthalmology, orthopedics (knee, hip, and spine), thoracic oncology and urology.

With an overwhelming demand for more minimally-invasive surgical procedures, St. Joseph Hospital has made the expansion of its robotics program a top priority.

We have recruited a fellowship-trained surgeon in advanced robotics as a first step in expanding this vital program and will continue recruiting additional robotic experts. To ramp up the program even further, the hospital has acquired a new robotic-assisted surgery system: the da Vinci X®.

In robotic surgery, the surgeon's human capability is harnessed and enhanced. Surgeries are performed through several keyhole incisions or, for certain surgeries, just one small strategically-placed hole with cosmetic outcomes in mind. For example, the incision can be "hidden" in the navel. The ability to operate through such a small opening is due, in part, to the 360-degree high-definition visual field that the surgical robot provides. Binocular 3D real-time imaging allows surgeons to see with natural depth perception

and to zoom in to magnify areas as they work.

The da Vinci X is equipped with four small articulated arms that mimic the surgeon's wrist and hand movements while offering significantly increased dexterity and 360-degree maneuverability. This allows the surgeon even greater precision and control of a full range of surgical instruments.

Enhancements to our robotics program, including the da Vinci X robotic system, represent a \$2 million philanthropic priority that is part of the hospital's \$50 million *Innovating for a Healthier Community* comprehensive campaign. - Reduced pain — less narcotic pain medication
- Smaller incisions — better cosmetic results
- Lower risk of infection and nerve damage
- Reduced blood loss — less need for transfusions
- Shorter hospital stays and recovery times
- Fewer re-admissions
- Lower cost for certain surgeries

"I was amazed by the treatment. I left the hospital the day after robotic prostate cancer surgery. They prescribed pain medication and I didn't even need to use it. I was worried that the surgery might affect my ability to run, but two months after surgery I was able to begin distance training. Only six months after surgery I completed the Los Angeles Marathon. New Mobile Medical Unit Rolling into Neighborhoods

Since 1996, St. Joseph Hospital's Puente a la Salud (Bridges to Health) mobile clinics have been rolling into agricultural fields and some of the poorest Orange County neighborhoods to provide comprehensive dental, vision and primary medical care for our underserved populations. But normal wear and tear takes a toll on equipment and one of our mobile units was forced to retire, too old to make the trip safely.

Patients who were being treated — if they wanted continued health care — would have to make the trip to St. Joseph Hospital's fixed site clinic (La Amistad on Main Street) often requiring at least one bus ride and sometimes two or three transfers to reach the clinic.

Fortunately, through the generosity of an anonymous donor in December 2017, a new mobile medical unit is now on the road serving individuals in their own or nearby neighborhoods.

“Valentina’s” story exemplifies the impact of our mobile clinics. Valentina is 65 years old with a history of unmanaged diabetes that had affected her vision. Even though her husband worked to support her, at times she went without diabetic

medication and supplies because they did not have the money to pay for them.

Our mobile clinic went to Valentina’s neighborhood and the caregivers were able to treat her as well as teach her about self-care. Because she doesn’t drive and it was difficult for her to walk or use public transportation, this was a godsend. Recently she qualified under CalOptima and was able to receive eye surgery which preserved and, thankfully, improved her vision. Valentina has worked hard to learn to manage her medical conditions, She is grateful for all the care and support she has received from clinic staff. Valentina and her family now see a much better future.

Ivan M. Turpin has been an active plastic surgeon at St. Joseph Hospital for over 35 years. Innovation and Technology Project Updates

Imaging options expanded with new PET/CT Digital Scanner™

Last year, thanks to the generous philanthropic support of the community, St. Joseph Hospital was one of the first three hospitals in the nation to acquire the new leading edge GE Discovery™ MI PET/CT scanner.

In the first twelve months of operation, over 1,820 patient scans were performed, 104 of them for children. Patients appreciate the new scanning room for its aesthetics and comfort features, and the speed of the scanner. And, more importantly, the new technology opens the door to the earliest possible detection of cancer, with reduced radiation exposure.

The new Linear Accelerator arriving soon at St. Joseph Hospital

The Varian TrueBeam® Radiotherapy Linear Accelerator will soon be in operation — increasing treatment options and giving thousands of patients the best possible chance of becoming free of cancer. This innovative technology increases our ability to precisely locate and image tumors, as well as provide radiation treatment that is more accurately focused with fewer side-effects — thus enhancing our patients' quality of life.

Our new linear accelerator will be installed and fully operational at The Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment at St. Joseph Hospital by January 2019.

The TrueBeam® Linear Accelerator is faster, safer and more powerful than the current machine it replaces. It destroys cancer by precisely focusing high-energy rays on cancer cells while preserving healthy tissues bordering the tumor. This advanced radiotherapy technology will allow our caregivers to treat more adult and pediatric patients, help achieve better treatment results, and improve each patient's experience.

IRA Charitable Rollover Gifts

Reduce Your Tax Burden Even If You Don't Itemize

An IRA charitable rollover gift:



Satisfies your annual required minimum distribution, or RMD, up to the amount of your gift.



Allows you to give from pre-tax assets and your distribution is excluded from taxable income.



Helps avoid limits on charitable deductions and prevents you from being pushed into a higher tax bracket.



Simplifies the giving process. It's easy to do — just notify your IRA custodian.



Minimizes the effect your giving has on your cash flow. The gift is from your assets, not your checkbook.

Important Considerations for IRA Charitable Rollover Gifts

- To take advantage of the benefits of an IRA rollover gift this year, start the process early.
- To make this type of a gift, you must be at least 70½ years old.
- Gifts of up to \$100,000 per year can be made from traditional or Roth IRA accounts. (If you don't have an IRA, but have another retirement account such as a 401(k) or 403(b), a tax-exempt transfer to create an IRA would be a necessary first step before making your gift. Call us and we can help.)
- Provide your IRA custodian with written instructions to make a direct gift from your IRA payable to St. Joseph Hospital to arrive before year end.
- If you plan to make a gift of this type, please let us know in advance so that we can credit and thank you appropriately. A custodian may sometimes send a check without accompanying documentation.
