Shirley Moretti has a strong commitment to St. Joseph Hospital and to helping others. Immediately after recuperating from breast cancer surgery and follow-up treatments, Shirley volunteered to assist newly diagnosed patients through their cancer journey, including supporting her two sisters.

Her interest in helping breast cancer patients led to her involvement with the Cordelia Knott Wellness Foundation. As president, she later directed the merger between this organization and the St. Joseph Hospital Foundation. This merger created the opportunity for a much-desired appearance center and boutique in The Center for Cancer Prevention and Treatment, now called Ginny's Shop. Shirley was involved in every aspect of the design of Ginny's Shop and continues to work there as a volunteer, giving hope to many as she shares her own cancer experiences.

Shirley joined the St. Joseph Hospital Foundation Board in 2012. In 2014 she was named the Spirit of St. Joseph Award Honoree in recognition of her outstanding contributions of time, talent and treasure. Her relationships with other individuals and organizations have resulted in additional support for cancer services.

Currently serving as Co-Chair of the

Innovating for a Healthier Community Campaign, Shirley always leads by example. In addition to establishing a charitable remainder trust (CRT) with St. Joseph Hospital as the beneficiary, Shirley has recently made an extraordinary planned gift by signing an irrevocable estate pledge to establish the Shirley J. Moretti Nurse Navigator Endowment and to make a sizeable donation to the Emergency Care Center. The Nurse Navigator Program offers patients and their families the valuable resources they need to not only navigate through the healthcare journey, but calm the mind, strengthen the spirit and concentrate on what matters most healing.

Like St. Joseph, Shirley is a protector and benefactor to the many people she encounters. She is a humble and quiet leader, supporter and friend, but Shirley lets her energy and passion speak on her behalf.
